FIRST MALAYSIAN FAMILY LIFE SURVEY, 1976-1977 (ICPSR 6170)

SUMMARY: The First Malaysian Family Life Survey, 1976-1977 (MFLS-1), was conducted in Peninsular Malaysia as a retrospective life history survey of 1,262 households containing an ever-married woman aged 50 or younger. Full life histories were collected through personal interviews with these women and their husbands regarding fertility-related events, marriage, employment, migration, income and wealth, attitudes and expectations with respect to family size and composition, community characteristics, time allocation, and transfers of goods, help, and money between the respondents and others. The survey collected data in three separate rounds held at four-month intervals. The majority of the survey was administered in Round 1, while the second and third rounds collected data on new questions not asked in Round 1 and also updated some of the Round 1 data, most notably the work and pregnancy histories. In October 1981, the individual-level dataset (Part 142) was created, consisting of one fixed-length record per individual per household. Variables included at both the individual and household levels provide information on demographics, time allocation, and income and wealth. Due to processing constraints, most of the retrospective data have been omitted from the individual-level dataset.

UNIVERSE: Ever-married women aged 50 or younger and their current spouses living in Peninsular Malaysia.

SAMPLING: The sample consisted of 1,262 households in 52 areas in Peninsular Malaysia containing an ever-married woman (one who had been married at least once) aged 50 or younger. Forty-nine of the areas were selected by area probability methods and three were purposively selected to give additional representation to Indian families and to families living in fishing communities.

NOTE: (1) This data collection was created by the principal investigators to replace their hierarchical version, which is not distributed by ICPSR. This multifile version also contains four files not included in the hierarchical version: Parts 93 and 94, Female and Male Recall Test Data, and Parts 92 and 141, Infant Feeding/Amenorrhea Update Data. In addition, Part 136, Round 3: MF10MIG1--Male Migration Card 1, Part 137, Round 3: Repunched MF10 Data, and Part 138, Round 3: MF10REV--Revised MF10 Data, contain updated data not in the hierarchical version. (2) This data collection can be combined with SECOND MALAYSIAN FAMILY LIFE

SURVEY: 1988 INTERVIEWS (ICPSR 9805) to provide a retrospective history of the respondents from the 1940s to 1988. (3) At the request of the principal investigators, it should be noted that variables V1416R3, V1417R3, V1418R3, and V1419R3 in Part 142, Individual-Level Data, are not reliable and should be ignored.

I. INTRODUCTION

This section describes the Malaysian Family Life Survey (MFLS), the survey instruments, the history and development of the individual-level dataset, and some points of special interest to users of the dataset.

THE MALAYSIAN FAMILY LIFE SURVEY

The Malaysian Family Life Survey (MFLS) consists of three rounds of data gathered in Peninsular Malaysia in 1976 and 1977. The sample for the study was 1262 private households, each containing at least one ever-married woman (i.e., one who has been married at least once, regardless of her present marital status) less than 50 years of age at the time of the initial visit.

The sample households were contained in 52 Primary Sampling Units (PSUs) in Peninsular Malaysia. Forty-nine of the PSUs were selected by area probability sampling methods. Three PSUs were purposively selected to give additional representation to Indian families and to families living in fishing communities.

The questionnaires used were designed to provide data for estimating the magnitude of key economic and biomedical relationships affecting birth-spacing, family size, and breastfeeding patterns of families. The goal was to identify factors amenable to public policy influence that directly or indirectly affect fertility outcomes. The types of data gathered include demographic variables, primary demographic and biological conditioning factors, major determinants of opportunity cost of a woman's time with children, major components of the family's economic resources, and community factors of primary interest. SURVEY INSTRUMENTS

The project employed a longitudinal survey design consisting of three rounds, four months apart. Questionnaires were field tested and subsequently modified by Survey Research Malaysia. The purpose of each questionnaire is briefly described below. This information is summarized in Table 1. A detailed description and codebook may be found in Terry Fain and Tan Poh Kheong, THE MALAYSIAN FAMILY LIFE SURVEY: APPENDIX E. MASTER CODEBOOK, The Rand Corporation, R-2351/5-AID, January 1982.

MF1: HOUSEHOLD ROSTER

Questionnaire MF1 was administered to the selected ever-married woman (EMW) or other adult female household member who has lived with the household for at least one year. This questionnaire was administered during the first survey round and repeated during subsequent rounds.

The Household Roster records the demographic characteristics of all persons who currently live in the household and of other persons who lived with the household for at least three of the last twelve months. This information was used to determine the eligible respondents for the other questionnaires. In MF1, each resident was assigned a personal identification number that was used to identify him or her in other questionnaires and subsequent survey rounds.

The following types of information were collected in MF1: composition of household; relationships among household members; number of months each member resided in the household in the last twelve months; ethnic community; sex, birthdate, age, and marital status of each household member; literacy (reading and writing ability); current attendance in school; highest level of schooling completed by each member; highest school certificate obtained; and basic characteristics of the last school attended by each member.

MF2: FEMALE RETROSPECTIVE

This questionnaire was administered to all selected EMWs less than 50 years old. It was given during the first survey round and updated during subsequent rounds.

MF2 elicits a life history of pregnancies, lactations, first postpartum menstruations, contraceptive use, marital status changes, migrations, house characteristics and household composition, help with children, and education and training of each respondent, as well as a work history that includes occupation, amount of time worked for each job held, and earnings at intervals of not more than three years. The information in MF2 was documented from age 15, age at first marriage, or age at first pregnancy, whichever was earliest.

MF3: MALE RETROSPECTIVE

This questionnaire was administered to all present husbands of selected women less than 50 years old. It was administered during the first survey round only.

The Male Retrospective questionnaire elicits a life history, from age 15 or first marriage (whichever is earlier) to the present, covering schooling and training, marital status changes, occupations, earnings, amount of time worked, property owned, and gifts, inheritances, and dowries received.

MF4 AND MF5: TIME BUDGETS

MF4 and MF5 were administered in each survey round to female respondents and their present husbands, producing documentation of seasonal variation in time allocation.

For all market and nonmarket activities of interest, including all jobs, unpaid family work, schooling, training, cottage industry, housework, and child care (but excluding recreational activities and sleep), MF4 and MF5 document the number of hours spent at the activity in the last seven days the activity was performed, the number of weeks the activity was performed in the last four months,

the rate of pay (if any) in cash and/or kind for the activity, distance from home to the place of the activity, amount of help received, and presence of children less than 11 years old while the activity was being performed. Time use of eligible male and female respondents, of their children living with them, and of other helpers (paid or unpaid) is documented.

MF6: INCOME AND WEALTH

Data on income and wealth were collected for each sample household in MF6. The primary respondent was the male head of household; if he was not present or was unable to give complete information on all categories covered in this questionnaire, other household members were interviewed. MF6 was administered during each survey round. The reference period is 12 months in the first round and 4 months in the second and third rounds.

This questionnaire gathers information on all income (except that covered in MF4 and MF5) received by the household in the reference period, quantities of property and durable goods owned, and changes in these components of wealth in the reference period. Data were collected on agricultural production; ownership of animals; businesses owned; services performed; gifts from non-household members; inheritances or dowries received; income from insurance, pensions, retirement programs, or interest; income received from renting out rooms, houses, or land; ownership of land; and possession of durable goods. In addition, MF6 collects information on money borrowed or interest paid in the reference period and on whether the respondent or spouse, or both, are covered by the government retirement program Employees' Provident Fund (E.P.F.)), have any kind of insurance, and/or have had money in a bank or savings account in the reference period.

MF7 AND MF8: ATTITUDES AND EXPECTATIONS

These questionnaires were administered only during the second survey round to all EMWs less than 50 years old and to their present husbands.

The Attitudes and Expectations questionnaires elicit information about ages at which sons and daughters became helpful in various activities, expected occupations and educational attainment of children, help in cash, goods, and services that respondents have given to their parents and help they receive or expect to receive from their own children, other types of expected old-age support, desired family size, number of respondents' siblings, education and occupation of respondents' parents, and opinions regarding various fertility-related areas.

MF9: NETWORKS OF SUPPORT

This questionnaire was added to the project in the third round of the survey. The network questionnaire's purpose is to document flows of goods, help, and money (including loans) between respondents in this sample and their relatives, friends, and acquaintances. The questionnaire documents the types, durations, amounts, and directions

of transfers during the previous 12 months, and the obligations incurred because of the transfers. The questionnaire was administered to the EMW.

MF10: MALE MIGRATION

This questionnaire was administered to the husband in the third round. Its purpose is to determine the extent of geographic mobility, and to ascertain the causes and consequences of families' migration. The questionnaire covers all the moves made by the respondent, and then focuses on the most recent time the respondent made a complete change of home and workplace. It examines the following features of this migration: distance moved, accompaniment of family, reasons for moving, where lived on arrival, economic support received and employment status after moving, prior knowledge of destination, return moves back to origin, and remittances to and from the area of origin.

MF11: COMMUNITY QUESTIONNAIRE

For each primary sampling unit in the sample, information was collected covering schools, family planning clinics, job markets, job training programs, public utilities, and prices of relevant commodities. This questionnaire also gives a historical perspective on epidemics, floods, or droughts. The questionnaire was administered to a variable number of spokespersons in each community, and where necessary, it was supplemented from external information sources. The data were collected throughout the survey period.

THE INDIVIDUAL-LEVEL DATASET

The dataset consisting of raw MFLS data is hierarchical in structure. For each household, and for each questionnaire administered in a given round, there is a summary record, followed by a variable number of fixed-length records. This configuration, while economical for data storage, is not ideal for analysis. In particular, certain research hypotheses for which the unit of analysis is the individual require another configuration of the data. Early users of the MFLS saw a need for a dataset consisting of one fixed-length record per individual, and the individual-level dataset was created to fill this need.

The focus of the individual-level dataset is on current micro-economic variables. Demographic, time allocation, and income and wealth information are present in the individual-level dataset, both at the individual level and at the household level. Virtually all of the retrospective data have been omitted from the individual-level dataset, since processing these data requires a different approach. (See Iva MacLennan, RETRO: A COMPUTER PROGRAM FOR PROCESSING LIFE HISTORY DATA, The Rand Corporation, R-2363-AID/RF, March 1978; see also Terry Fain, THREE METHODS FOR PROCESSING LIFE HISTORY DATA, The Rand Corporation, N-1544-AID, July 1980.)

Since its creation in 1978, the individual-level dataset has been used in a number of research designs. Omissions and errors in the early versions of the dataset have been ferreted out by users,

and later versions are larger and more accurate as a result. The version of the tape to which this codebook applies was created in October 1981.

USING THE INDIVIDUAL-LEVEL DATA

The dynamic nature of the MFLS data over three rounds contributes to both the richness of the data and the difficulty in using them. This is as true of the individual-level dataset as of the raw data. This section describes some features of the individual-level dataset which will be of interest to users of the data, discusses some difficulties commonly encountered in using the dataset, and outlines solutions to these difficulties.

It is important to distinguish between individual-level variables and household-level variables. Some variables, such as age, sex, and education, exist for every individual in the sample. Others, such as the number of persons aged 10-14 in the household, are defined only at the household level. But some concepts lend themselves to both levels. For example, in the following codebook, variable 273 tells the number of farms owned by the household, i.e., by all household members combined, while variable 291 gives the number of farms owned by the individual. Throughout the codebook, household-level variables are indicated by an asterisk (*). All individuals in a given household will have the same value for a household-level variable.

Except where noted, MF6 (Income and Wealth) variables have different reference periods for the three rounds. Round 1 variables refer to the 12 months before the Round 1 survey, while variables from Rounds 2 and 3 refer to the 4 months before the Round 2 and Round 3 survey, respectively.

Perhaps the greatest source of possible confusion lies in the fact that a given individual may or may not be present in any survey round or combination of rounds. Users who are interested in looking at a single round of data may determine who was present in that round by examining these dummy variables: variable 944 for Round 1, variable 945 for Round 2, and variable 1420 for Round 3. If an individual is present in a given round, demographic variables for that round (variables 1-69 for Round 1, variables 471-539 for Round 2, and variables 946-1014 for Round 3) will contain meaningful data for that round; otherwise these variables will contain all zeros and/or blanks for that round.

A similar problem arises if we wish to partition the data into households. For example, one might ask the number of individuals in each household who are working in the family business. Such a question necessitates summation over the individuals in a household, and this in turn requires information on how many records are present for each household. The solution is to take the maximum over the three rounds of the number of persons present in the household in that round (variable 28 in Round 1, variable 498 in Round 2, and variable 973 in Round 3). The number of records present for a given household will always be equal to this maximum.

In the following codebook, complete column locations are given only for Round 1 variables. The location of the corresponding variables in Round 2 can be determined by adding 1861 to the column locations given for Round 1. To determine the location of corresponding Round 3 variables, add 3742 to the Round 1 location, or add 1881 to the Round 2 location. Column locations for variables unique to Rounds 2 and 3 are given in Secs. III and IV, respectively.

II. INDIVIDUAL-LEVEL CODEBOOK

The individual-level data was created from the original hierarchical version of the MFLS-1 data as were the subfiles. The ROUND 1 MFLS1 roster has 7,498 people, while the individual file contains 7,496 people from the ROUND 1 roster. Two people from ROUND 1 roster who do not have a round 1 record in the individual file are.....

CASE=464, PERSON=112; CASE=719, PERSON=202.

The 112 person is a grandson of the household head (Chinese family) and is an infant. The 202 person is a nephew of the hhld head (Indian family) and is 14 years old and in school.

At the end of the codebook are 3 tables describing full column locations, variable names, and value labels. Full SPSS and SAS data definition statements have been provided.

PREFACE

This document describes an alternative format for data from the First Malaysian Family Life Survey (MFLS-1) wherein different card types have been split out into separate subfiles. Users of MFLS-1 data may find this multiple-subfile format easier to use than the original single-file hierarchical format. The subfiles have the same record layout as described in the MFLS-1 Codebook (see below). In addition, this document describes the repunched and revised MFLS-1 male migration history data from MF10, and describes four new files containing data not included on the original public release MFLS-1 tape. The revised MF10 data, which is included among the original MFLS-1 subfiles, covers only the dates and locations of moves by husbands of the MFLS-1 female respondent; thus, the revised MF10 data is only a subset of the entire set of MF10 questions. The four new data files contain some recall test questions and updated infant feeding and amenorrhea information for women with children under age three. Users should consult the following RAND publications for detailed documentation on MFLS-1:

SUMMARY

The original 1976 Malaysian Family Life Survey (MFLS-1) data was available in a hierarchical data file that pooled records with different input formats. To simplify use of the MFLS-1 data, the original pooled file was split out into separate subfiles, one for each of the 71 different record types. Users can now select just those files needed for their analyses. The multiple-subfile version of MFLS-1 parallels that of the 1988 Second Malaysian Family Life Survey (MFLS-2). This similarity in format eases the process of linking data for individuals interviewed in both time periods, 1976 and 1988.

This document briefly discusses the process of "splitting out" different file types from the MFLS-1 raw data and then presents a description of the new MFLS-1 subfiles. Variable descriptions and coding are supplied by the MFLS-1 Codebook (R-2351/5-AID: *The Malaysian Family Life Survey, Appendix E: Master Codebook*, January 1982, by Terry Fain and Tan Poh Kheong). The documentation for the MFLS-1 subfiles consists of a table-lookup that links each file with the file's relevant section in the MFLS-1 Codebook.

The MFLS-1 split files include two data files not originally collected in 1976. These files represent updated information on the Male Migration file MF10. The original 1976 MF10 data was missing a large number of records. As part of MFLS-2 in 1988, RAND asked the National Population and Family Development Board of Malaysia to repunch just the migration histories from the original MF10 recording forms. The entire set of MF10 questions was not repunched, only the dates and locations of moves that were recorded in MF10. The repunched MF10 data, which turned out to contain only a subset of the MF10 households, are included among the MFLS-1 split files. RAND analysts compared the old MF10 and new MF10 and combined information from both files to create a revised MF10 file containing only move dates and locations. This revised MF10 file is also included with the MFLS-1 split files.

The MFLS-1 split files also include four data files with information that was not included on the original public release MFLS-1 hierarchical data file. The contents of these files, then, do not appear in R-2351/5, the *Master Codebook*. Their content appears in *The Malaysian Family Life Survey: Appendix A, Questionnaires and Interviewer Instructions* (R-2351/1-AID, March 1978, by William P. Butz, Julie DaVanzo, Dorothy Z. Fernandez, Robert Jones, and Nyle Spoelstra). Two files represent data collected only in Round 2, where the female respondent was again asked about her place of birth, her residence at age 15, her employment at age 15, schooling at age 15, and the breastfeeding status of her first child;

and the male respondent was asked about his employment and schooling at age 15 plus initial asset ownership. The remaining two files represent data collected in Round 2 and Round 3 on female respondents that sought to fill in information on open infant feeding/amenorrhea intervals as of the end of Rounds 1 and Round 2, respectively.

1. INTRODUCTION

The Malaysian Family Life Survey (MFLS-1) was conducted in 1976-1977 as a retrospective life history survey for 1,262 households containing an ever-married woman age 50 or less. The survey, administered only in Peninsular Malaysia, collected data in three separate rounds held at 4 month intervals. Round 1 was done August-December 1976, Round 2 was conducted January-April 1977, and Round 3 occurred May-August 1977. The majority of the survey was administered in Round 1. The second and third rounds collected data on new questions not asked in Round 1, plus updated some of the Round 1 questions, most notable being the work and pregnancy histories.

In 1988, a second Malaysian Family Life Survey (MFLS-2) was conducted, which asked many of the same types of questions as in MFLS-1. One objective of that survey was to follow up the women originally interviewed in 1976 and to interview a selected set of their adult children.¹ The MFLS-2 also interviewed a new set of women of reproductive age in Peninsular Malaysia plus a sample of Malaysians age 50 and older.

When combined, the MFLS-1 and MFLS-2 data provide a long retrospective history running from the 1940s to 1988. In addition, because the reinterviewed original MFLS-1 respondents were asked a complete retrospective history up to 1988, and not just about the intervening 12 years, the linking of MFLS-1 and MFLS-2 responses enables the examination of various recall issues.

The original public release of the MFLS-1 database consisted of three hierarchical files, one for each round. Each file contained records of various types (e.g., pregnancies, marriages, and changes of residence) for a given household. A different data format was used for the MFLS-2 database to improve ease of use, one based on a set of subfiles representing records of different types (e.g., one file contained marriages and another file contained pregnancies). Thus, to facilitate the linking of the original MFLS-1 data and that of MFLS-2, we decided to create a subfile version of the MFLS-1 data.

MFLS-2 afforded an opportunity to investigate problems with the original MF10 male migration data. MFLS-1 recording forms were located, and migration histories from MF10 were repunched. The repunched MF10 data is also included as part of the MFLS-1 release.

In the process of working with the MFLS-1, we discovered some data that were not included on the original public release MFLS-1 hierarchical data. While this data had always been available on request, the new split file structure allowed that data to be easily incorporated into the MFLS-1 database. That newly released information is contained in four separate subfiles. Two files deal with experimental recall test data, and two files provide update information on infant feeding/amenorrhea intervals that were open at the ends of Rounds 1 and 2.

The purpose of this report is to provide documentation for these newly created MFLS-1 subfiles. A brief discussion of the subfile creation process is presented in Section 2. Section 3 contains a description of the subfiles. The basic description for each subfile consists of a crosswalk linking the given subfile to a section of the MFLS-1 Codebook. This document, then, is meant to be used in conjunction with the original MFLS-1 documentation and is not a substitute.²

This report contains six appendices. Appendix A lists the SAS[®] programs used to split out the MFLS-1 data from Rounds 1, 2, and 3 into separate subfiles for each round. Appendix B describes the revised MF10 male migration file that is included on the tape. Appendix C provides the variable definitions and locations for the recall test, and Appendix D does the same for the infant feeding/amenorrhea update data. Appendix E is applicable only to those outside of RAND and contains the layout for the data tape containing the raw data versions of the MFLS-1 subfiles. The last appendix, Appendix F, is applicable to RAND users only and contains the locations of the MFLS-1 subfiles stored on RAND's UNIX system.

2. CREATION OF MFLS-1 SUBFILES

In this section, we outline the process used to create the various MFLS-1 subfiles. We also briefly discuss what little data cleaning was done as part of the "splitting out" process.

SPLITTING OUT MFLS-1 SUBFILES

A separate set of subfiles was created for each of the three rounds of the MFLS-1 data. In the original public release MFLS-1 database, the Round 2 data file contained all the Round 1 records plus any new records added as a result of new questions asked in Round 2 plus any updates to existing records or new events (e.g., new job since Round 1); the Round 3 data file contained all records from Rounds 1 and 2 plus any new records added or updated as a result of the Round 3 responses. The Round 1 file contains all 1,262 households interviewed; the Round 2 file contains only those households that completed Round 2 (1,216 households), and the Round 3 has only the 1,181 households that completed Round 3.

We split the MFLS-1 data in each round into separate flat rectangular files based on questionnaire type (QNO, column 2 on each record), event type (EVENTYPE, column 3 on each record), and, for some files, CARDTYPE (the column location of this variable was file-dependent but in most cases it was column 10) was also used to distinguish a given subfile type. For example, the female migration history data had QNO=2 and EVENTYPE=3; the woman's first marriage data had QNO=2, EVENTYPE=1, and CARDTYPE=1. Appendix A contains the SAS programs used to split out the Round 1, Round 2, and Round 3 data. All subfiles had a fixed length of 80 characters.

In all, 71 separate subfile types were created from the original hierarchical MFLS-1 data, although all 71 do not appear in each round. Thirty-eight files relate to information obtained in Round 1 (of these, 31 appear in all three rounds); 13 files contain data collected only in Round 2; 11 files contain data collected only in Round 3; 2 files contain data collected only in Round 2 and Round 3; 7 files are related to the MFLS-1 community data. In addition, there are 6 subfiles that come from data that was not part of the original hierarchical data (MF10 repunch, recall test and infant feeding/amenorrhea update data).

At RAND, SAS file versions were created for each subfile. The SAS files for each round are stored in separate directories, e.g., Round 1 files are located in the Round 1 directory.³

DATA CLEANING AND DATA UPDATES

We limited the data cleaning to checks for invalid data, e.g., character data in numeric fields or inconsistent record type identifiers. No other data checks were done. Only a handful of invalid data fields were uncovered and corrected.⁴

We did not update Round 1 data with information from Rounds 2 and 3. It is up to the user to decide how to update the data. Users should refer to *The Malaysian Family Life Survey: Appendix E, Master Codebook*, R-2351/5-AID, January 1982, by Terry Fain and Tan Poh Kheong, for specific information on the data updates. There are two types of updates between Round 1 and Rounds 2 and 3. In the first type, the files are a "snapshot" in time. That is, Round 1 data was carried over to Round 2 and specific variables were updated. The variable ROUND was updated to reflect this. In the second type of updates, a "transaction" record was collected, with just identification information and the change/update; no other information is on the record. We did not apply any transactions. A third type of change between Round 1 and Rounds 2 and 3 involved the addition of new events that occurred between rounds.

REVISED MF10 DATA

In 1977, the male migration history, MF10, was collected as part of Round 3 of the MFLS-1 survey. The objective of MF10 was to record all interdistrict moves by the spouses of the MFLS-1 female respondents, up to and including the last move that brought the spouse to his current residence. When the data arrived at RAND in 1978, simple data checking revealed some serious data entry errors had occurred. In a number of cases, the last move was not recorded; in other cases, the number of moves appeared to be too few. Users of the MF10 data were warned of the problems and nothing further was done with the MF10 data.

With the fielding of MFLS-2 in 1988, the opportunity to repunch the MF10 data arose. The National Population and Family Development Board (Lembaga Penduduk dan

Pembangunan Keluarga Negara, or LPPKN) staff located the MLFS-1 questionnaires in a Kuala Lumpur warehouse and had them moved to the LPPKN office. Upon examining the MF10 recording forms, we discovered what had gone wrong in 1977. The MF10 instrument had a line for the last move that was separated on the page from the lines where previous moves were recorded. This confused some MFLS-1 keypunchers, and thus the last move was sometimes missed. In addition, editors had drawn lines through various moves, some of which were interdistrict and some that were intradistrict.

We asked LPPKN keypunchers to only repunch the migration history data (i.e., the moves with their dates and locations) listed on the MF10 and not the entire MF10 questionnaire.⁵ Moves were to be entered regardless of whether they had been crossed out. The MF10 migration history data were repunched in 1989. Of the 944 expected MF10s (i.e., the number of spouses present at Round 3 who completed MF10), the newly punched MF10 file had only 504 households entered, or 53 percent. The majority of these cases, 350, were households that originally had no MF10 records in the 1977 punched data. The repunched moves from the MF10, then, were completely new data with no counterpart in the 1977 MF10 data. The remaining 154 households had MF10 records entered in 1977; the repunched MF10 move data covered moves previously listed plus new ones. Compared to the 390 males originally entered in 1977 but not reentered in 1989, the 154 had fewer moves on average. Thus, the repunched MF10 data tend to include only those households where the 1977 data entry problems were most acute—those that had no MF10 records and those with only a few moves listed in the 1977 interview.

The old MF10 migration history data and repunched MF10 data on moves were compared and a new revised version of the male migration history was created. The new data is a composite of the original and repunched MF10 move data, which includes data cleaned here at RAND, and contains just the household identifiers, migration sequence numbers, district and state of each move, plus the date and age of respondent at each move. The revised MF10 move data still include cases where the migration data appear to be insufficient or inconsistent. A status variable is included on the file to indicate which households still appear to have incomplete migration histories.

⁵The original migration history data is found in the subfile MF10MIG1. Only a subset of the information in MF10MIG1 was repunched by LPPKN. MF10 data found in the subfiles, MF10SUM, MF10MIG2, and MF10MON, were not repunched since those data were deemed to be correct.

RECALL TEST DATA

In Round 2, a small set of questions was asked again of the female and male respondents as part of an experiment in verification. The female respondent was asked to repeat information on her place of birth, where she lived at age 15, her education status at age 15, and, if in school at age 15, when she finished school, initiation and duration of breastfeeding for her first child, and date of her first job since age 15.

Male respondents were asked to repeat information on enrollment status at age 15, and, if enrolled, the date they finished, whether they had a training course since age 15 and when it started, when they began their first job, whether they ever owned property, and, if so, when they first owned property.

The female responses are in R2MF2_1.RAW and the male responses in R2MF3_1.RAW.⁶ Input statements for those two files are in R2MF2_1.PGM and R2MF3_1.PGM, respectively.

These data had not been released as part of the original MFLS-1 public-use data but were available upon request.

INFANT FEEDING/AMENORRHEA UPDATE DATA

At the end of Round 1, there were a number of women who were still breastfeeding their youngest child and, along with others who recently gave birth, had not yet resumed their menstrual cycle. In an effort to close some of those open intervals, the Round 2 and 3 surveys included an additional set of questions asked of women with children under age 3, born before the end of the previous round. The women were asked about the child's breastfeeding status, whether the child had been given anything other than breast milk and when, and whether menses had resumed and when.

These data were not used to update infant feeding or amenorrhea information in the Rounds 2 and 3 pregnancy histories. Thus, users wishing to complete any open Round 1 intervals will need to merge these data onto the Round 2 and 3 pregnancy histories.

The infant feeding/amenorrhea update data collected in Round 2 are in R2MF2_BF.RAW; the Round 3 data are in R3MF2_BF.RAW.⁷ Input statements to read these files are available in the following files: R2MF2_BF.PGM and R3MF2_BF.PGM.

3. DESCRIPTIONS OF MFLS-1 SUBFILES

The MFLS-1 codebook⁸ provides the sample and variable descriptions for the MFLS-1 subfiles files, except for newly released data. The attached table gives the page number in the MFLS-1 codebook where each file's description begins.

The descriptions of the split-out MFLS-1 files are contained in Table 3.1. The table contains the following items:

File name: This is the basic file name. To distinguish rounds, this name is concatenated with an extension indicating round (.RND1, .RND2, or .RND3), for the flat files. On UNIX, this name is the SAS file name, and each round is in a separate directory.

Page: Refers to the page number in the MFLS-1 codebook where the documentation for that file begins.

Round: 1 indicates the file is available in Round 1; 2 indicates the file is available in Round 2; 3 indicates the file is available in Round 3.

Number of Records: Indicates the number of records in each round.

Because they are not original MFLS-1 data from the MFLS-1 Codebook, the repunched and revised MF10 files, recall test files, and infant feeding/amenorrhea update files do not appear in Table 3.1. Descriptions for MF10 files, named MF1089 and MF10REV, respectively, appear in Appendix B; descriptions for the recall test files are in Appendix C; and descriptions of the infant feeding/amenorrhea update files are in Appendix D.

4. FORMAT OF MFLS-1 SUBFILES

In this short section, we describe the public-use versions of the MFLS-1 subfiles. The public-use versions are available only as flat rectangular files and are issued only on magnetic tape. Appendix E provides the tape layout for the MFLS-1 subfile public-use version. In-house RAND users may consult Appendix F for the location of the MFLS-1 subfiles on the RAND UNIX system.

The MFLS-1 subfiles are written on IBM standard label tape, 6250 bpi. All files have a record length of 80 and a blocksize of 8000. Subfiles related to Round 1 end with the suffix .RND1; those for Round 2 end in .RND2; those for Round 3 end in .RND3.

Input statements for each file type are also provided on the tape, and the input statement files carry the same name as the file they read (e.g., MF2PREG has the input statement for MF2PREG.RND1, MF2PREG.RND2, and MF2PREG.RND3). The variable names used in the input statements are based on the MFLS-1 codebook page and column numbers for the variable. For example, the variable name P70C28 refers to the variable listed on page 70 that starts in column 28 (in this case, birthweight of child in pounds). Users may edit the input statements to rename variables to desired nomenclature. The input statement files also have a record length of 80 and a blocksize of 8000.

A few variables do not follow the above naming convention. Because certain variables are on all files, we named them consistently across files. These variables are the first 4 variables on all files. They are ROUND (round number found in column 1), QNO, (questionnaire number found in column 2), EVENTYPE (event type found in column 3), and CASE (household identification number found in columns 4 to 7).

In addition, variables that were not previously released do not follow the above naming convention. These variables do not appear in the MFLS-1 master codebook and thus cannot be referenced in the above manner. The names for these variables appear in the Appendices describing the newly released data: revised MF10 in Appendix B; recall test data in Appendix C; and infant feeding/amenorrhea update data in Appendix D.

Appendix A

MFLS-1 SUBFILE CREATION PROGRAMS

Below are the SAS programs run on each round to create the MFLS-1 subfiles from the original public-release MFLS-1 hierarchical data. The first program splits all MFLS-1 subfiles except for the farm card files and the MF11 community data. The programs used for Rounds 1, 2, and 3 are included. The second program splits out the farm files, which had a slightly different format and thus needed a modified version of the overall split program. This program was the same for all rounds, so only the Round 1 program is presented. The third program splits out the different MF11 community subfiles; the MF11 data is found only in the Round 1 data. The fourth program shows how to combine the three crop cards into one "crop" file; the fifth program combines the two business cards into one "business" file. These last two programs also did not vary across rounds, so only the Round 1 version is presented.

Appendix B
DESCRIPTION OF REPUNCHED AND REVISED MF10 SUBFILES

The original repunched data received from LPPKN is in the file called MF1089. The data are entered as multiple records per household with the multiple moves recorded on each line. There are 556 records representing 504 households. The program to read these data is called READ1089.PGM and is provided with the data.

The revised MF10 data, called MF10REV, has one record for each recorded move by an MF10 respondent, for a total of 4322 records, representing the 895 households where MF10 was filled out by the male spouse. The record contains the CASE number, the migration number, the age and date of the move, the state and district destination associated with the move, and a flag for migration data completeness (99 households still appear to have incomplete migration histories). The Round 2 responses are in a file called R2MF2_BF.RAW, which has 153 records; the Round 3 file is called R3MF2_BF.RAW and has 146 records. The layout is the same for both the Round 2 and 3 data and is presented below:

Appendix F

RAND USERS ONLY: MFLS-1 SUBFILES ON THE RAND UNIX SYSTEM

Both raw file and SAS file versions of the MFLS-1 subfiles are available on the RAND UNIX system. For those wishing to use the raw file versions, text files containing input statements for each file type are available as well. Below we note the location of both the raw file and SAS file versions.

RAW FILES

The raw files are in the subdirectory **/home/depot/datafac/files/MFLS1/RAW**. The raw files are all compressed. The list of data files appearing in Appendix B, the data tape layout, also represents the file names contained in the above subdirectory. Again, Round 1 file names are concatenated with **.rnd1**; Round 2 file names are concatenated with **.rnd2**; and Round 3 file names are concatenated with **.rnd3**.

The MFLS-1 split raw files are in *UNIX compressed format*. To read these files, you will want to use a **zcat** command to uncompress the needed file and redirect the output to a different disk. For example, **cd** to the above directory, then do a **zcat filename.Z > /pathname** to write the uncompressed file to the directory listed in **/pathname**. The raw files are kept compressed to save space since most people will be using the SAS file versions.

“Input” statements for each file type are stored in the subdirectory **/home/depot/datafac/files/MFLS1/RAW/INPUT**. Each file in this subdirectory contains the variable names and column locations of one raw file. The file names in this subdirectory match the file names listed in Table 3.1. The input statements are the same across rounds whenever a file type appears in more than one round. The variable names follow the naming convention discussed above for the non-RAND user’s version of the MFLS-1 subfiles; that is, the variable name reflects the MFLS-1 codebook page number and starting column location for the variable. As stated above, only the first four variables on each file have “regular” variable names; those variables are **ROUND**, **QNO**, **EVENTYPE**, and **CASE**.

Variable labels are also available. Text files containing SAS label statements are in the **home/depot/datafac/files/MFLS1/RAW/LABEL** subdirectory. In general, the labels are the same across rounds. In a few cases, the labels are different in subsequent rounds. The suffixes **r2**, **r3**, or **r23** at the end of the file names indicate a difference. The suffix **r2** refers to a difference in the Round 2 labels, **r3** refers to a difference in the Round 3 labels, and **r23** refers to a difference in Rounds 2 and 3.

SAS FILES

The SAS files were created with SAS version 6.07 using the SAS “compress” option and are stored in *UNIX compressed format* as well. The SAS names are the same as those listed in Table 3.1. Each round’s set of files is stored in a different subdirectory. Those subdirectories are:

Round 1: **/home/depot/datafac/files/MFLS1/SAS/RND1**

Round 2: **/home/depot/datafac/files/MFLS1/SAS/RND2**

Round 3: **/home/depot/datafac/files/MFLS1/SAS/RND3**

Recall

and

Update: **/home/depot/datafac/files/MFLS1/SAS/NEW2_3**

We incorporated the MFLS-1 codebook (R-2351/5-AID, January 1982) documentation into the naming convention of the SAS variables. Each name consists of two parts, a page number and a starting column location. For example, the variable **P87C23** refers to a variable documented on page 87 with a starting location of column 23. A few variables did not follow the above naming convention. Because certain variables are on all files, we named them consistently across files. These variables are the first 4 variables on all files. They are **ROUND**, **QNO**, **EVENTYPE**, and **CASE**. Labels have been attached to all variables in the SAS files. For the MF10 and recall and update files, the variable names match those given in Appendix B (MF10), Appendix C (recall), and Appendix D (update).

COMBINED SAS FILES

In the original data, the results from two sections of the MF6 questionnaire were split into multiple files. This was done because the data was organized in “card” (80 column) format, and the variables from the questionnaire sections spanned more than one card. We have recombined these files. We combined the **mf6crop1**, **mf6crop2** and **mf6crop3** files into **mf6crop**, using **CASE**, farm number (column 11), and edit reference number (column 8) to match records. We combined the **mf6bus1** and **mf6bus2** files into **mf6bus**, using **CASE**, business number within household (column 11), and edit reference number (column 8) to match records. These combined “crop” and “business” files have no raw file counterpart. These combined files exist only in SAS format.
